Contents and Arrangements

1. Series 1: George Town World Heritage Incorporated (GTHWI)

GTHWI was established in 2010 by the Penang State Government as the main management body to mobilise local stakeholders, in particular the local community, to spearhead efforts in safeguarding the Outstanding Universal Value (OUV) of George Town UNESCO World Heritage Site. MDA has four publications of booklet, brochure and foldable card game by GTHWI.

1.1. Item: Cherita Lebuh Chulia booklet

Notes: This illustrated booklet is part of an oral history documentation project where the aim is to encourage community participation in constructing local history in George Town. It has presented the collective memory of the residence of Chulia Street from the 1940s to 1970s that consist of various trades, festival/cultural processions, and everyday activities.

Some keypoints in this booklet: Fazal Mohd. & Co. and Medina, kain pulikat, Chingay festival, Wah Fong photo studio, Lorong Pencuri (Thieves' Market), cart pullers, perm parlours, flying kites at Alimsah Waley, opposite of Odeon Theatre and the compound of Ng Fook Tong, shophouses, and Lorong Candu (Opium Lane) and Aik Seng Bazaar slum areas.

The traditional games includes Nillaikalakki Silambam, Sepak Raga, Shaolin Wushu, Yoga, Nondi (Hopscotch), Tudung Tin, Kikkli, Kola Kolaya Mundhirikai (Handkerchief Game), Fo Shan Lion Dance, Skipping Rope, Chingay, Thayam/ Chukkin, Pandu Atta, Batu Tujuh/ Sottangal, Guli, Baling Selipar, Congkak/ Pallangguli, Silat Kapi/ Silat Gayong, Animal Chess, Pick-up Sticks, Kali Toi/ Toi, Uri Adithal, and Gasing.

Think City is an impact organisation established in 2009, wholly-owned subsidiary of Khazanah Nasional. The organisation aims to create more sustainable and equitable places for the benefit of all, focusing on urban solutions, the environment, social communities and cultural economy.

2.1. Item: Perjalanan Harmoni. Satu Lawatan Teroka-Sendiri brochure

Notes: This illustrated brochure details five religious buildings along Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling, also known as Harmony Street (Jalan Harmoni in Bahasa Melayu) as these religious spaces co-exist together along the same street, sharing similar nature elements such as water, sunlight, lunar cycle, and flowers. The buildings are Goddess of Mercy Temple (Tokong Kuan Yin), Lebuh Acheh Mosque (Masjid Melayu Lebuh Acheh), Kapitan Keling Mosque (Masjid Kapitan Keling), St. George Church (Gereja St. George), and Sri Mahamariamman Temple (Kuil Sri Maha Mariamman)

3. Series 3: Arts-ED

Arts-ED is a non-profit organisation (NPO) based in Penang, Malaysia, https://www.arts-ed.my/. The organisation provides innovative community-based arts and culture education in rural and urban communities. Their programs focus on the theme of arts, culture and heritage and utilise creative educational approaches that encourage learning around real issues. MDA has 16 publications of brochures and booklets by Arts-ED.

3.1. Item: Traditional Trade and Food brochures

Notes: These brochures are part of a project under the Anak-Anak Kota program by Arts-ED, designed and researched by Penang secondary school students.



They have documented the history of traditional traders and craftsmen by illustrating drawings and diagrams with textual descriptions in George Town, Penang. This project produced 17 illustrated brochures.MDA archive has 12 out of the 17 brochures.

- Brochures on traditional food consist of Roti Benggali (Benggali Bread),
 Poh Piah Wrappers, Coconut Tarts, Ais Tingkap (Window Sherbet), and
 Yu Char Kuih (Dough Fritters)
- Brochures on endangered trades consist of Rattan Chair Weaver, Signboard Engraver, Fortune Telling, Songkok (Local Islamic Headgear), Ottu Kedai (Stuck-on Sundry Store), Kim Guan Coffee Factory, and Tomb Stone Engravers.

The booklet features Corner Shophouse (Heng Seng Kopitiam), Chinese Hokkien Temple (Hock Teik Cheng Sin), Commercial Shophouse (Edelweiss Cafe), Art-Deco Facade, Signage & Signboards, Modern Facade, Godown (Gudang Acheh), Penang Shophouse Styles, Malay Mosque Complex, Indo-Malay Style Compound Houses, Gardened Terrace Townhouses, and Chinese Clan Complex (Khoo Kongsi)

3.3. Item: My George Town booklet, English and Mandarin version
